

Students Should Hone their Knowledge, Humanity, and Nationality

At Airlangga Convention Center (ACC) Campus C UNAIR on Thursday, 1 August, UNAIR Rector Prof. Dr. Moch. Nasih, S.E., M.T., CMA, officially welcomed the University's new students that consisted of 1901 male students and 5081 female students. Among them, 844 students were Bidikmisi educational aid grantees.

In the event, Prof. Nasih affirmed that UNAIR is an inclusive university, which means everyone has a right to study there. He also mentioned that in practice, UNAIR puts forward science, humanity, and nationality. "During your study, you will be pushed and forged in those three aspects at the same time," he said.

Prof. Nasih added that studying has its ethics. Students should school their reason and heart, not only physically attend. By employing their logic and soul simultaneously, they will achieve excellence with morality.

"What is just as important, before pursuing knowledge, one has to settle his intention. This step is essential to do, and the best intention to pursue knowledge during college days is to provide benefits for others," Prof. Nasih said.

One day after that, on Friday, 2 August, Prof. Nasih delivered a presentation before the new students' parents at Garuda Mukti Hall, 5th floor of UNAIR Management Office. Prof. Nasih also shared some material on UNAIR's vision and mission, which he claimed to be very clear. That is, to be prominent, independent, and innovative, whether at the national or international level. Moreover, to be the pioneer of knowledge that is based on humanities and moral. Therefore, the Rector stated, every policy at UNAIR always refers to the "BEST" motto, that is Based on Morality, Excellent (academic, research, and community development) Smart Academic Culture, and Target Oriented.
