MUSEUM OF ETHNOGRAPHY WINS AN AWARD

The Head of Center for Death Study FISIP UNAIR Toetik Koesbardijati, PhD holds the Purwakalagrha Award from Indonesia Museum Awards 2018, for the category of Unique Museum.

Museum of Ethnography and Center for Death Study at Faculty of Social and Political Sciences Universitas Airlangga (FISIP UNAIR) won a national award on 15 October 2018. The award, Anugerah Purwakalagrha Indonesia Museum Awards 2018, was given to the Museum for being the only unique museum in Indonesia.

The Head of the Museum Toetik Koesbardijati PhD said that the award was an unpredictable success to her. However, for the previous three years, Komunitas Jelajah as the award organizer had observed the development and

every innovation done by the Museum.

Winning the award, in her opinion, was nothing but part of the efforts and innovations all parties at the Museum continuously worked on. To her, the museum did not only function as facilities of education and recreation, but also a medium for research or study.

“Museum of Ethnography and Center for Death Study at FISIP UNAIR revives a museum’s functions as a medium for research or study,” she elaborated.

UNAIR Rector Prof. Nasih mentioned that the Museum’s achievement was highly appreciated. Regarding the success, Prof. Nasih hoped that all programs at UNAIR had their own specialty and original project like Anthropology Program which managed Museum of Ethnography and Center for Death Study FISIP UNAIR. “Success which FISIP recently achieved should be an inspiration for other faculties and programs,” he confirmed. EDUTAINMENT A LA FACULTY OF PUBLIC HEALTH

A group of students from Faculty of Public Health (FKM) Universitas Airlangga has founded a health community TIKKOPH (Public Health Communication Team) as a medium for FKM students who are interested in health education for the society.

Milada Muhammad, an FKM student from Class of 2017, clarified that TIKKOPH, which is under Department of Community Service BEM FKM UNAIR, aims to educate its members to give social service and empowerment directly to the society.

“Since it comes from the community service, social service and empowerment club at BEM FKM UNAIR, TIKKOPH is founded for FKM students to train their soft skills in empowering the society so that after we graduate we can serve the society. It is in line with FKM itself, which requires its graduates to be able to give social service,”

said Milada, Head of TIKKOPH Community.

In giving its service, TIKKOPH collaborates with Natha Aruna community at Rangkah Cemetery Surabaya as the education spot. The reason behind this is that Natha Aruna has previously asked TIKKOPH to educate their fostered children about health.

Meanwhile, FKM has also introduced Edutainment concept as part of its community service programs for teenagers. One of the lecturers, Muthmainnah S.KM., M.Kes., said that Edutainment is an effort to promote health which entertains and fun in accordance with the characters of teenagers. (*)

One achievement which recently made was from the event of C-Gen Co-Creation Competition. Two Universitas Airlangga students, Tri Wahyudi from Faculty of Pharmacy and his partner Shabri Atha Arfiansyah from Faculty of Vocational Studies, collaborated with Garda Pangan Social Care Community Surabaya to participate in the event.

From the event which was held by C-Gen Indonesia at Universitas Dian Nuswantoro Semarang on last 12 October 2018, they brought home the second best predicate in the category of Smart Solution for Smart City. The two students presented a topic on the Application of food bank concept to deal with food scarcity in Surabaya.

Meanwhile, two students from Faculty of Pharmacy (FF) won the First Place of Pharasoed Video Competition at Faculty of Pharmacy Universitas Jendral Soedirman Purwokerto which was held on 5 - 7 October 2018. The two successful students, Saafinatun Najah (FF 2016) and Istna (FF 2016), chose "Healthy Life Style" for the theme of their video and titled it "Easy Steps to be Healthy." The

video showed a guide and some practices to maintain health in this modern era.

On a different occasion, Fajri Kurnia Larasanty and Isnaini Nur Amalina, two students from Faculty of Humanities (FIB) had a chance to join a culinary research conducted by Indonesian Institute of Sciences (LIPI) along with Research and Development Directorate of Creative Economy Agency (BEKRAF). The culinary research was held in Songputri Hamlet Sindukarto Village Eromoko Sub-district Wonogiri Regency from Friday to Sunday, 5 - 7 October 2018.

In the meantime, the programs to show caring for others were implemented by Student Executive Board of Faculty of Economics and Business on Saturday, 13 October 2108. The Board held a social service in the campus surrounding community by distributing food to those in need. Moreover, they also ran a mini music concert for fund raising which would be donated to victims of natural disasters. (*)

VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AS THE KEY TO GLOBAL COMPETITION

On Tuesday, 16 October 2018 Universitas Airlangga became the host for the 5th Indonesia Vocational Higher Education Forum (FPT-VI). This year's Forum, which raised the theme of "Indonesia Vocational Universities Encounter Industrial Revolution 4.0", took place in Garuda Mukti Hall, Universitas Airlangga Management Office.

Attended the event were Universitas Airlangga Rector Prof. Dr. Mohammad Nasih, SE., Mt., Ak., CMA., Vice Rector I Prof. Djoko Santoso, dr., PhD., Sp.PD., K-GH., FINASIM, the Head of FPTVI Dr. Ir. Arief Daryanto, M. Ec., FPTVI management, as well as lecturers and students of Vocational Studies.

There were three speakers giving their presentation namely Dr. H. Soekarwo, SH., M. Hum as the Governor of East Java, Dr. Ir. Mohammad Rudy Salahudin, MEM as the Deputy IV at Coordinating Division of Creative Economy, Entrepreneurship, and Cooperative and Small Medium-sized Enterprises' Competitiveness at Ministry of Economic Coordinator Republic Indonesia, as well as Denni Puspa Purbasari, SE., M. Sc., PhD as the Deputy III at Division of Strategic Economic Issues Study and Management at Presidential Staff Republic Indonesia.

In his speech, Dr. Arief elaborated that there were some programs to celebrate the 5th FPTVI, namely international congress to showcase products from vocational studies, Indonesia Vocational Studies Olympiad (OLIVIA), and international congress in the field of vocational studies in Indonesia.

"After a series of congress in several universities, the 5th FPTVI is held here in Universitas Airlangga. After this, usually, the Chairman of FPTVI comes from Universitas Airlangga," he mentioned.

Meanwhile, Prof. Djoko Santoso, dr., Ph.D., Sp.PD., K-GH., FINASIM said that the challenges for vocational studies grad-

uates were getting tougher and the skill requirements were getting higher. Vocational Higher Education could be the key to build working system in entering global competition.

"The very important thing is to build cooperation between vocational education management and industrial sector," he added.

Prof. Djoko also said that the cooperation might take form of program and curriculum arrangements, expert lecturer and instructor appointment, facilities and infrastructure support, as well as certification. The cooperation was a priority which needed a careful consideration in its implementation.

"Certification is essential for vocational studies graduates to be recognized by business and industrial sectors, yet still very low in number by far," he added.

The policy on vocational studies development was welcomed by Universitas Airlangga. Various actions had been taken to optimize the quality of the studies. During the congress, UNAIR Rector Prof. Nasih shared information about the campus' policy direction to support vocational education in Indonesia.

Prof. Nasih said that since establishing Faculty of Vocational Studies in 2014, UNAIR had been continuously setting policies which supported the development of vocational education. One of the policies was that Faculty of Vocational Studies UNAIR would raise the opportunity for vocational high school (SMK) graduates to be accepted in the upcoming academic year.

"It is possible that the percentage of SMK graduates to be accepted at Faculty of Vocational Studies will reach 70%. General and Islamic high school graduates will be suggested to take Bachelor Programs, considering the kind of secondary education received by the graduates is different from each other," he explained. (*)

In his speech, Madyan suggested alumni inauguration to be a moment to reinforce the alumni's role for alma mater and the nation. He also mentioned the efforts UNAIR had put to be one of top 500 world class universities. To achieve the goal, all programs and innovations from the campus needed full support from every part of the alumni.

"Surely, all efforts and attempts from us, who are still in campus now, need suggestions, need support and encouragement from our fellow alumni; whether support in a form of ideas, thoughts, or any kind of support," he said.

Meanwhile, adding the statement from the Vice Rector II, Dr. Muhammad Taufiqy S., Sp.OG(K) as the Chairman of IKA UA Central Java Chapter said that after the inauguration, his party would hold a number of activities. In his agenda, the first thing to do was a management internal consolidation since not everyone in the newly appointed management knew each other's character.

The next day, PP IKA UA inaugurated IKA UA Management for South Sumatera Chapter. Similar to the one in Semarang, the event which took place in Horison Ultima Hotel Palembang on Sunday 14 October 2018 was also arranged in a form of alumni reunion.

Tenth of UNAIR alumni with different professions who lived all across South Sumatera attended the event. On behalf of the Rector, Vice Rector IV Junaidi

Khotib PhD was present and delivered a speech. In his speech, Junaidi encouraged the newly appointed management to do the given job and mandate very well.

Moreover, Junaidi also suggested every part of the management to actively hold various activities which would include all alumni who spread across South Sumatera. In his opinion, by doing so the bond between alumni would be stronger.

As a response to the statement from the Vice Rector IV, the Chairman of IKA UA South Sumatera Chapter Dr. dr. Anang Tri Wibowo Sp.M(K) said that the efforts to embrace all alumni in South Sumatera would begin by network strengthening, whether through activities or social medias.
