The day before, Saturday, March 9, 2019, Prof Nasih also graduated 1121 students. In total, for March 2019 Graduation, there were 2306 students graduated by UNAIR Rector. In his remarks, Prof. Nasih gave some advice to all graduates, on their responsibilities after graduation as educated citizens.

"The insight that you gained during your time in university requires you to develop your knowledge. Including for community service to our nation and state," he said. THREE FACULTIES READY FOR ASIIN INTERNATIONAL ACCREDITATION

One of the efforts is made through ASIIN accreditation (Accreditation Agency for Degree Programs in Engineering, Informatics/Computer Science, the Natural Sciences, and Mathematics) for its faculties.

On Monday, March 5, UNAIR received international accreditation visitation for its three faculties: Faculty of Dental Medicine (FKG), Faculty of Veterinary Medicine (FKH), and Faculty of Fisheries and Marine.

As one of the state universities with teaching hospitals, Universitas Airlangga has the responsibility to be a center for medical research and service in Indonesia. Through Universitas Airlangga Teaching Hospital (RSUA), UNAIR continues to offer variety of services. Both for general public, as well as academics and medical researchers.

One of the breakthroughs from RSUA is a medical check-up service for international program students, especially for scholarship applicants and students who continue their education abroad.

Head of RSUA Marketing Division, dr. Niken Sasadhara Sasmita said that the service is a form of support to all UNAIR students who continue their education abroad. Reflecting on the previous year, continued Dr. Niken, the percentage of students applying for medical check-up services continued to increase. It includes the number of students from UNAIR. “Not only for students of Universitas Airlangga, but also for general students. However, in percentage, from UNAIR reached 60-70 percent,” she added.

The program called Airlangga Integrated MCU (Medical Check-Up) for Scholarship, was a response to the increasing scientific activities abroad conducted by UNAIR. There is a rising trend on number of students interested in applying for scholarships abroad
